Drone Beuys, the collaborative collective led by Adam Fung and Nick Bontrager, works with experimentations with drones, video, animation, sculptural forms. Our projects are created from sources derived of field

expeditions, studies, and research ranging from west Texas Iceland to the Tuscany. We are interested in physical state changes, as suggested by the above and Beuys quote the dichotomy of extraction and renewal

Using data and i magery directly observed-the collaboration with the landscape shifts to the studios of Fung and Bontrager as they respond to contemporary issues and technologies. Evoking a pl ethora of Anthropocene ecological era disasters, this new work by Drone presents a m vriad of scenarios to counter what is often a bleak prognosis, forms shifting and collapsing within themselves (and into each other)- in a tectonic arena positing a nar rative of the principles of destruction but also hope for an al chemy of future technology, shifting principles, and as ublime an encounter with space. Ultimately. we see principles of destruction manifesto for paradigms shifts that necessary in are our contemporary We cultures. believe art can be an avenue to plant the seeds of change-opening up new ideas and conversation
